**One Great Hour of Sharing Update:** Thank You to everyone who contributed to the One Great Hour of Sharing offering on Easter Sunday. We received \$3,193 to send to assist our brothers and sisters in Christ in our neighborhoods and across the world.

**Report from the Bartow County Resource Office:** In March 2011, this office assisted 106 families, consisting of 213 adults, and 80 children (293 individuals total) with assistance totaling \$7,197.37. Rental assistance: 320.00; Utility assistance: 5802.60; Prescription drug assistance: 844.77; gas vouchers: 210.00, and other food and medical needs. They also referred 29 people to the Community Church Shop, assisted 2 families with beds, 2 with bus tickets, 1 with an eye exam, and 1 with a GA ID. **Each month, our church sends a contribution to this office, in addition to what we spend from the Deacon's Fund to support their work. Thank you for your generous gifts to support those in the community who have nowhere else to turn for help.**

**At its stated monthly meeting on May 10, 2011, the Session took the following actions:**

- Set a Congregational Meeting on June 26 for the election of officers for the 2012-2015 term.
- Upon a motion and second, agreed to seek the Endowment Committee's approval to provide \$2,000 from the church's endowment proceeds to the Community Church Shop for roof repair work.
- Met with a representative from Cherokee Presbytery's Committee on Ministry for the triennial visit as called for in the Book of Order.

**Committee reports:**

**Stewardship and Finance:** The church deficit for the year through April 30 is \$37,374, which is about \$20,000 less than at the same time last year.

**Diaconate:** The church gathered and dropped off several supplies for tornado victims and was waiting to hear about when more supplies are needed. The church has been added to the work team list and will be contacted when crews are needed to help with clean up. The One Great Hour of Sharing Easter offering raised more than \$3,000, which was more than last year.

**Properties:** The roof over the kitchen has been repaired, and several other minor repairs related to the leak in the roof are being completed. The sanctuary doors are slated for replacement by the end of May.

**Outreach:** A new member/introduction to FPC class in May had 10 people.

**Deaths:** Carl White died May 8, 2011. A memorial service was held for him on May 11.

**Tornado Response Update**

When the April 27<sup>th</sup> tornados and storms struck, our congregation responded almost immediately and generously within Bartow County.

- We collected and delivered supplies requested by county and local officials
- Financial contributions were received and used to purchase supplies needed by individual families that they were unable to purchase for themselves
- Volunteers went to help remove debris and clear home-sites

When a disaster strikes, the days following are chaotic. It takes time for needs to be assessed, plans to be made, insurance companies to respond, and recovery to begin. The process takes time. Our church has not ended our response to the disasters. Here is what we know about help that is still needed:

- The county does not need any more donations of food and supplies at this time.
- We are on multiple contact lists for the county as well as for Presbyterian Disaster Assistance to be contacted when clean-up efforts are organized and groups can be of use and hosted.
- The county is recommending that churches adopt individual families and work with them for six months to a year to aid their recovery individually rather than scatter relief efforts. FPC is in the process of identifying a family to work with long-term.
- The need will not end next week, next month, or next year. Disaster response organization takes time. We continue to monitor where and how we can be of service without causing further complication or harm to those affected, and will pass those opportunities along to you as they become known.

How you can help right now:

- The spring storms across the country depleted the supply of Gift of the Heart Kits across the country. You can make kits and bring them to the church for shipment. Kits include baby kits, cleanup buckets, school kits, and hygiene kits. For more information, visit: <http://gamc.pcusa.org/ministries/pda/making-gift-heart-kits/>.
- Continue to pray for the victims of the storms and those working with them.
- Be alert to organized service opportunities and pass that information along to Pastor Julie or Hallie Eberlein, chair of the Mission and Witness Committee.
