- **Just-as-I-Am July is coming Sundays starting July 10.** We will have one service of worship in the Fellowship Hall, uniting our congregation for joyful worship.

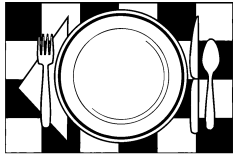

A Note from the Good Neighbor Shelter

Each month a portion of our mission giving goes to support the Good Neighbor Shelter and their work. Dennis Collier is working for the Mission and Witness Committee to continue our hands on relationship with the Good Neighbor Shelter. If you are interested in working with them, please contact Dennis.

Did you know that the Angels on Wheels will help with transportation to and from medical appointments, physical therapy, and other treatments? The Angels on Wheels consist of volunteers from the church who volunteer their time to help get church members to doctor's appointments, chemo, physical therapy, or other tests. We can also help with day to day transport if you are unable to drive for medical reasons (medications, seizures, broken limbs etc). At its stated monthly meeting on April 12, 2011, the Session made the following decisions:

- Authorized the clerk to contact several members of the church who are being considered for transfer to the inactive membership list.
- The Session approved the recommendation of the Stewardship and Finance Committee that Phil Bridges, Janet Martin, Brac Panter, Charlie Strong, Julie Cauffman and Earl Williamson be authorized to count the offerings from worship services.
- The Session voted to approve two small revisions to the Safe Sanctuaries policy to remove conflicts with the Hands of Christ and preschool programs.

Committee reports:

Stewardship and Finance: The church deficit through March 31 is about \$33,000. Last year at the same time, it was more than \$45,000. The committee is considering ways for the church to be more flexible in how it accepts pledge gifts and other payments, including debit cards and EFTs.

Christian Education: The Safe Sanctuaries policy was revised to remove two minor conflicts with policies of the preschool and Hands of Christ programs. Vacation Bible School is planned for June 6-10.

Diaconate: The next blood drive will be Wednesday, May 4. The Society of the Saints is planning a May 14 outing to a Rome Braves game and a weekly Wednesday lunch at Chick-fil-A during the summer months when there are no Wednesday night suppers.

Properties: The ice machine in the kitchen had to be replaced after more than 20 years. The roof over the kitchen will be replaced as soon as weather permits. Work on the front doors of the church is ongoing. A workday has been scheduled for May 14. A pump failure in the old boiler room resulted in some flooding. The pump will be checked.

Preschool Board: The Preschool Board has developed a new brochure and is carefully monitoring enrollment for the coming school year. It is working on developing a full-day pre-K class for next year, and is considering adding a kindergarten class in the future.

Officer Nominating Committee: The committee is contacting people to ask them to serve as officers for the class of 2014. A congregational meeting to elect officers is anticipated in June.

Imagine 2020 Visioning Team: The team is having a full-day retreat on May 7 to put the feedback it has received into a final report with recommendations.

What in the world is the Liturgical Arts Committee and what do they do??

First Presbyterian Church Cartersville values the arts as an uplifting path to worship God. Our Presbyterian Book of Order makes these 2 statements: *Artistic expressions should evoke, edify, enhance, and expand worshipers' consciousness of the reality and grace of God. And, When these artistic creations awaken us to God's presence, they are appropriate for worship. (W-1.2001 The language of Response to God)*

Liturgical art, broadly speaking, is visual art that enhances worship. It includes banners, painted murals, outdoor sculptures, but it could also be liturgical dance or drama.

The Liturgical Arts Committee believes that art can provide glimpses into the Divine and acknowledge that there is more to God than we can ever express. Each of us is made in the image of God, the Creator. By being creative, we are using the gifts God gave us to return praise and honor to God.

The Liturgical Arts Committee at First Presbyterian Church Cartersville is made up of artists of many kinds and serves the church as a part of the Worship Committee. We are excited to learn about how we can use art to enrich the worship life of our church.



Seeing Scripture
